Message Recap

The Magi traveled further than anyone expected, guided by a faint light and a quiet conviction. They were educated, respected, influential...yet when they finally entered the house where Jesus was, everything inside them shifted.

The Magi show us the posture of wisdom:

Wise people recognize greatness even when it arrives quietly.

Wise people bow their way into strength.

Wise people worship with their life, not just their moments.

Wise people understand that worship accelerates transformation.

Worship isn't a Sunday event. It's the posture that shapes a life. A bowed heart becomes an unshakable life. When you kneel, God lifts. When you surrender, God strengthens. When you bow, heaven meets you where you are.

Discussion Questions

- Why do you think posture matters so much in our walk with God? What makes bowing/surrender difficult for you right now?
- Where are you trying to find strength in your own talent, success, or control? What might it look like this week to bow your way into strength instead of striving for it?

- What's one place in your weekly routine where worship could become a posture instead of a moment? How might that change the way you handle stress, pressure, or discouragement?
- Romans 12:1 says transformation happens when we *offer* ourselves. What is one thing you need to offer, not hide, so God can transform it?
